

Building Australia's Best Hellenic Greek Studies Program

Established in 2012, the Guardians of Greek Language and Culture (more commonly known as The Greek Guardians) has worked together with the Northern Territory's Greek and wider community to secure the University's Greek Language and Culture Program.



With an internationally recognised Greek language and culture study program incorporating an innovative research agenda focusing on Greek communities across the globe, CDU delivers Australia's most respected in-country study program. The program is accredited by the Greek Government as the Examination Centre for the Certificate of Attainment in Greek Language.

Ongoing Greek language and culture lectures are delivered both face-to-face and online at CDU's Casuarina Campus, and CDU plays host to International Conferences on Hellenic Diaspora, regular Greek poetry symposia, visiting academics and public lectures.

Ongoing support from the Greek Guardians will see CDU continue to deliver an outstanding Hellenic and Greek Language and Culture curriculum in undergraduate and post graduate studies, whilst supporting new initiatives such as scholarships and bursaries for students, visiting academic programs, ongoing research, research fellowships, and cultural exchanges.

Our Achievements


The achievements made by CDU's Greek Language and Culture Program are extensive, and include:





Greek In-Country Language Program

Immerse yourself in the language and culture of Greece.


The Greek In-Country language program is an excellent opportunity for students to experience Greek culture first-hand.

Offered in July each year, the program is available for everyone over 18 years of age. We offer three streams: beginners, intermediate and advanced. It combines coursework taught by lecturers from CDU, the University of the Aegean as well as other Greek Educational Institutions. This intensive three-week program is equivalent to a full unit of Greek language study.

The program may include Kalymnos and other islands, Athens, and a study trip in the northern mainland region of Macedonia.

The teaching approach is varied and includes traditional classroom learning and educational visits to museums and archaeological sites. The experience of fully immersing yourself in contemporary Greek life and culture ensures that you receive the most benefit from the program.



Τα πρώτα βήματα

Η Επιτροπή «**Θεματοφύλακες της Ελληνικής Γλώσσας και Πολιτισμού**» ιδρύεται το 2012, έχοντας την υποστήριξη της ευρύτερης παροικίας της Βόρειας Επικράτειας, με κύριο σκοπό να στηρίξει τις καινοτόμες διδακτικές καθώς και ερευνητικές πρωτοβουλίες του προγράμματος Ελληνικής Γλώσσας και Πολιτισμού στο πανεπιστήμιό μας.

Μεταξύ των καινοτόμων πρωτοβουλιών μας συγκαταλέγεται αφενός η έρευνα της Ελληνικής Διασποράς ανά τον κόσμο, με έμφαση ωστόσο την Αυστραλία και τη Βόρεια Επικράτεια, και αφετέρου ο μοναδικός και καινοτόμος Εντατικός Κύκλος Θερινών Μαθημάτων στην Ελλάδα που λειτουργεί ανελλιπώς από το 2007. Επιπροσθέτως, οι δραστηριότητές μας εμπερικλύουν τη διδασκαλία των μαθημάτων γλώσσας, λογοτεχνίας και ιστορίας σε προπτυχιακό και μεταπτυχιακό κύκλο με υβριδικό τρόπο, στο Ντάργουν και διαδικτυακά, την οργάνωση Διεθνών Συνεδρίων με θέμα την «Ελληνική Διασπορά», τις συνεχείς εκδόσεις μας, τη διοργάνωση συμποσίων, δημόσιων διαλέξεων, με επισκέπτες καθηγητές από Ελλάδα και αλλοχού.

Η Επιτροπή «**Θεματοφύλακες της Ελληνικής Γλώσσας και Πολιτισμού**» στηρίζει και θα στηρίζει τις ανωτέρω πρωτοβουλίες καθώς και τα νέα οράματα μέσα σε ένα πλαίσιο διεθνών συνεργασιών με αδελφά πανεπιστήμια στην Ελλάδα, όπως το Πανεπιστήμιο του Αιγαίου και το Πανεπιστήμιο της Μακεδονίας. Κύριος στόχος μας είναι η περαιτέρω στήριξη φοιτητών και φοιτητριών που σπουδάζουν την ελληνική γλώσσα και τον ελληνικό πολιτισμό. Η υποστήριξη αυτή συνεχίζεται σε προπτυχιακό και μεταπτυχιακό κύκλο, ενθαρρύνοντας περαιτέρω υποτροφίες σε φοιτητές/τριες, επισκέψεις ακαδημαϊκών/ερευνητών, καθώς και περαιτέρω έρευνα της τοπικής ιστορίας της Ελληνική Διασποράς στη Βόρεια Επικράτεια κ.ά.

Τα επιτεύγματά μας

- Την επί εικοσαετίας ανελλιπή παροχή των προγραμμάτων μας με πρωτοπόρο και διαδραστικό τρόπο, τόσο σε προπτυχιακό όσο και μεταπτυχιακό κύκλο με τρόπο υβριδικό με καινοτόμα διαδραστικά εργαλεία.
- Τη συνεχή συνεργασία με τα αδελφά πανεπιστήμια στην Ελλάδα, Πανεπιστήμιο του Αιγαίου από το 2007 και το Πανεπιστήμιο της Μακεδονίας από το 2014, ενθαρρύνοντας κοινά ερευνητικά έργα, πρωτοβουλίες και εφαρμογές χρηματοδότησης σε τομείς αμοιβαιότητας και διδασκαλίας, κοινή εποπτεία ανώτερου βαθμού από ερευνητές (μεταπτυχιακούς και διδακτορικούς) και συμμετοχή σε συνέδρια, σεμινάρια, συμπόσια και συνεργασία μέσα από δημοσιεύσεις αμοιβαίου ενδιαφέροντος.
- Τη διοργάνωση διεθνών συνεδρίων, συμποσίων, δημόσιων διαλέξεων.
- Την επί δεκαεπτά έτη οργάνωση του Θερινού Εντατικού Προγράμματος Ελληνικής Γλώσσας και Πολιτισμού στην Ελλάδα. Το 2023 οργανώνεται το 17ο πρόγραμμα.
- Τη συνεργασία με τη Διεθνή Κίνηση **Hellenic Initiative** και ειδικότερα το Πρόγραμμα «Μπορούμε» με τις ομάδες των φοιτητών μας κατά τις επισκέψεις μας στην Ελλάδα.
- Συνεργασίες σε ερευνητικά προγράμματα με γνωστά πανεπιστήμια ανά τον κόσμο.
- Τη λειτουργία Εξεταστικού Κέντρου Ελληνομάθειας μέσω του Κέντρου Ελληνικής Γλώσσας του Υπουργείου Παιδείας και Θρησκευμάτων της Ελλάδος.

Έρευνα – Έλληνες στη Βόρεια Επικράτεια

- Η Επιτροπή «Θεματοφύλακες της Ελληνικής Γλώσσας και Πολιτισμού» στηρίζει την έρευνα της ελληνικής παρουσίας στη Βόρεια Επικράτεια στις διαφορετικές μεταναστευτικές περιόδους αρχίζοντας από τους πρώτους ελληνικούς οικισμούς στο Ντάργουν την περίοδο του 1ου Παγκοσμίου Πολέμου μέχρι και τις μέρες μας.

Οι Γυναίκες στη Βόρεια Επικράτεια

- Ιδιαίτερη έμφαση δίνεται στη συμβολή των Γυναικών στη Βόρεια Επικράτεια από τις πρώτες παρουσίες και πρώτους γάμους το 1917 μέχρι και τη μαζική έλευση στις δεκαετίες του πενήντα, εξήντα και εβδομήντα. Το 2018 παρουσιάζεται το σεμινάριο των πρωτοπόρων γυναικών και ακολουθεί η έκδοση των τόμων μας με κείμενα αφιερωμένα στις γυναίκες.
