I have the honour to present to you David Carment whom Council has determined should be accorded the title of Emeritus Professor of the University.

Until his recent retirement, David had been employed at the University since 1983. He is recognized as one of Australia's leading experts on North Australian history and has been widely published on this topic. During his time at the University, and its predecessor institutions, Professor Carment played a significant role in the community serving terms on many committees and boards including those of the Professional Historians Association (Northern Territory) and the National Trust of Australia (Northern Territory). His service to the community was publicly recognised in 2003 when he was awarded a Member of the Order of Australia (AM).

Professor Carment has supervised many higher degree research students during his time at the University. He has always been a committed teacher and has successfully taught at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

During his time at the University, Professor Carment has served in the roles of Associate Dean, as a member of many university committees and for three years Dean of the Faculty of Law, Business and Arts.

Today, in recognition of his distinguished academic service to the University, outstanding contributions to the advancement of Northern Australian history, and commitment to the communities of the Northern Territory, David Carment has been accorded the title Emeritus Professor of the University.
