


Experiences On-Country

Our courses provide participants with immersive experiences that expose them to the diverse knowledge systems and traditions of Indigenous communities. By participating in cultural practices, listening to stories, and witnessing the resilience of Indigenous heritage, participants develop a heightened sense of selfawareness and cultural sensitivity, and develop skills for the practice of knowledge-work in intercultural contexts.

What does an On-Country experience mean?

If you are living in or visiting Australia, then you are always on Aboriginal land. We are always On-Country! CDU On-Country experiences are a program of activities and intercultural interactions intentionally held on the ancestral lands of Aboriginal Australians in the context of people exercising their sovereign cultural rights on their own land. This is not a tourist experience, it is a program of intentional, intercultural, educational experiences that help visitors to develop a better understanding both themselves and sovereign Aboriginal people.





Our Purpose

Charles Darwin University's programs of social and cultural immersion are designed to build capacity for you to work and learn more respectfully and productively with Indigenous Australians

Our work seeks to help our students and participants to recognise the colonising effects of their current thinking and work practices, and then build an understanding of and strategies for enacting decolonising practices.

Each program helps you to make sense of Indigenous ways of knowing, being, and doing.

You will benefit from:

- » Intercultural Competence: Develop a deeper understanding of working with difference in intercultural contexts.
- » Respectful Relations: Build meaningful connections with Indigenous Australians, fostering collaboration and mutual understanding.
- » Decolonising Practices: Recognise and begin the personal and collaborative work to address the impacts of institutional colonisation.

- » Professional Advantage: Gain intercultural competencies sought by employers in various fields.
- » Personal Growth: Broaden perspectives on knowledges and culture, challenge long held assumptions, and cultivate empathy.
- » Experiential Learning: Engage directly with Indigenous communities and learn from elders and leaders.

CDU's social and cultural immersion programs empower participants to engage respectfully and productively with Indigenous Australians, fostering deep understanding and promoting harmonious collaboration.

Students On-Country

Offers a transformative opportunity for University students and faculty to engage with Indigenous cultures and knowledge systems. This immersive program combines academic rigor with cultural immersion, fostering a holistic understanding of Indigenous perspectives and promoting meaningful collaborations between academia and Indigenous communities.

Academic components within the On-Country experience can vary depending on the disciplines and focus areas of the participating universities. Faculty and students may engage in research projects, collaborative workshops, or interdisciplinary courses that explore themes such as Indigenous knowledge systems, environmental sustainability, social justice, and reconciliation.

These academic pursuits are designed to integrate Indigenous perspectives, promote critical thinking, and encourage cross-cultural dialogue.

Collaboration with Indigenous communities is at the heart of the On-Country experience for universities.

Local Indigenous knowledge holders, community leaders, and educators serve as guides, mentors, and co-creators of knowledge in these immersive contexts.

By forging reciprocal relationships, universities contribute to community development initiatives, support Indigenous-led projects, and ensure that the benefits of the program flow back to the communities.

On-Country For Government

An On-Country experience for government departments provides a unique platform for policymakers and public servants to deepen their understanding of Indigenous cultures, knowledge systems, and the relationship between government and Indigenous communities. This immersive program combines policy-focused discussions with cultural immersion, fostering meaningful connections and informing more inclusive and effective governance practices.

Government officials engage directly with Indigenous communities, listening to their perspectives, learning about their governance structures, and witnessing the resilience of their cultures.

Through facilitated discussions, workshops, and cultural activities, participants gain insights into the historical context, contemporary challenges, and aspirations of Indigenous communities. This firsthand experience informs policy development, decision-making processes, and community engagement strategies.

When are On-Country courses offered?

Typically May to September as activities including camping "On-Country".

What accommodation is provided?

Accommodation On-Country is camping with accommodation provided as necessary at the start and end in International House on the CDU campus in Casuarina or other similar accommodation.

What is the duration of the courses?

On-Country courses can be anywhere between 3 and 5 days, depending on requirements.

What do they cost?

POA - Costs vary and are dependent on the type of On-Country experience, location and number of days including accommodation, transport from Darwin, food, and activities.

Can I receive credit for university level study?

Yes some courses do offer this.
